Just eleven months earlier they arrived at the tip of Cape Cod, as author Nathaniel Philbrick describes, "fearful and uniformed." Philbrick goes on to write, "They spent the next month alienating and angering every Native American they happened to come across. By all rights none of the Pilgrims should have emerged from the first winter alive." However, leaning on their faith and the extraordinary help from Native Americans, the Pilgrims survived. When the final harvest was in, the Pilgrims took a day off from their labors to eat and celebrate together and to give thanks to God.

- 2. **November 9, New Member Installation**, 10:15 a.m., sanctuary. That is always a reason to give thanks and celebrate.
- 3. November 9, Celebration of JIPC Ministries by turning in Pledge Cards. "Thank You Lunch" immediately after worship in the gym. With gratitude and joy, we pledge our time, talents, and money with anticipation to where God is leading us.
- 4. **November 16, Community Thanksgiving Service**, 4 pm, St. James Episcopal Church. JIPC and other churches in our community will gather to celebrate and give thanks to God. Money raised will go to **James Island Outreach**.
- 5. **November 23**, **Christ the King**, 10:15 a.m. sanctuary (The Lord's Supper). This is the last Sunday of the Christian Calendar.
- 6. **November 30**, *Advent* begins, 10:15 a.m., sanctuary and 5:00 p.m. dinner and wreath making in the gym. This year's Advent theme is "Our Family Tree."

I hope to see you at each of these gatherings this month. However, if your calendar will only allow you to do a few of them, begin with setting aside the Lord's Supper as a priority. None of us can predict what will take place over the next twelve months, but we know by starting at the Lord's Supper, there is hope through Jesus Christ.
